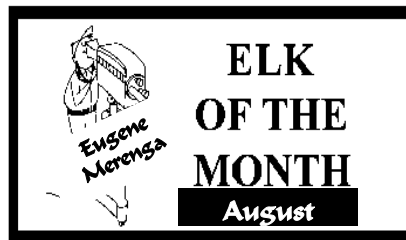


From the Sick bed desk of the Exalted Ruler

The "Most Valuable Student" Scholarship applications will be online starting September 1, 2010. This scholarship is open to high school seniors, who are citizens, and planning to go on to a four-year college. Students can download the applications or contact Bob or me for a copy of the application. The date, to turn the completed applications to the lodge, has not been announced yet.

The CHEA Vocational Grant applications are now available at <http://www.cheaelks.org>. The grants are in the amount of \$1,000 with an option to renew for one more year. The program is open to any prospective applicant, residing in California or Hawaii who is an American Citizen, planning to pursue an eligible vocational/technical course, above and supplemental to high school or preparatory school level. While high school seniors may apply, it is not limited to high school students. It is open to all prospective students who require training or retraining to compete in the workplace. Applications are due three months after receiving the application.
